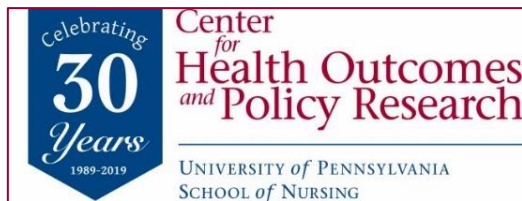
The Belgium Country Team at KU Leuven
